Fourth Today's gospel story is often called "the Prodigal Son" it could also be called the SUNDAY parable of the father and two sons. This story challenges us to love without limits. People often want their just rewards and so often identify with the older son. However, Jesus tells this parable to illustrate the depth of his Father's love and forgiveness. When we act like the younger brother, God will run toward us with love because we are headed in the right direction. Think about times when you were less sincere in offering an apology. Did God or someone else show you the depth of forgiveness that shows true love? When have you needed mercy or true love? When have you needed mercy or forgiveness and found it? The God revealed to us today by Jesus is as much a surprise to us his listeners. We put God high up on altars when he is likely to be found in the dark, trying to save his lost
